Dr. Archibald "Moonlight" Graham: You know we just don't recognize the most significant moments of our lives while they're happening.



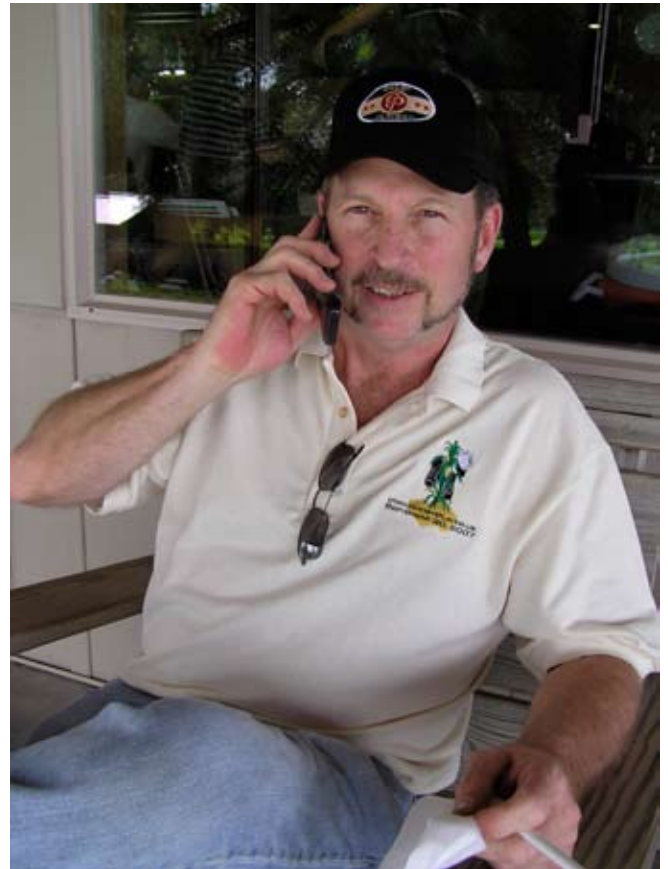
